



Public Service Announcement April 27, 2022

On April 30, 2022, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., the Big Spring Police Department Narcotics Division will work in collaboration with the Drug Enforcement Administration at the National Pharmaceutical Take Back Initiative. The event will be outside the north facing doors of the Howard County Jail located at 3611 West Highway 80.

This event provides a unified opportunity for the public to surrender expired, unwanted, or unused pharmaceutical controlled substances, dangerous drugs, and other medications to law enforcement officers for destruction.

Intra-venous solutions, injectibles, and syringes will not be accepted due to potential hazards posed by blood-borne pathogens.

This program is anonymous, and all efforts will be made to protect the identity of individuals disposing of medications. Participants may dispose of medication in its original container or by removing the medication from its container and disposing it directly into the disposal box. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original container.

We strongly encourage everyone who has expired medicine or medicine you no longer need or use, to utilize this opportunity to dispose of those medications SAFELY.
